



Junior Ranger Program – Indian Canyons



10 Steps to arranging your trip to the Indian Canyons and filling out the Bus Grant Application

- Step 1:** Read the packet. (10-Step Guide, Field Trip Bus Grants Information Sheet & Application)
- Step 2:** Reserve field trip date and time with Tribal Ranger Raven Longbow (contact information is located in the Field Trip Bus Grants Information Sheet).
- Step 3:** Research bus transportation costs (this will make filling out the Bus Grant Application easier).
- Step 4:** Fill out the Jr. Ranger Bus Grant Application.
- Step 5:** Submit the completed Jr. Ranger Bus Grant Application to JrRangerProgram@aguacaliente-nsn.gov 30 days before the field trip.
- Step 6:** Wait for a response on bus grant application status.
- Step 7:** You will receive an email within one week of date of submittal of application indicating the status of the application. If approved, a check will be mailed to the school in care of the applicant.
- Step 8:** Funds are to cover bus transportation costs only. Funds not used for bus transportation for your fieldtrip to the Indian Canyons shall be returned to Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians within 15 days of your scheduled field Trip. You are required to secure transportation.
- Step 9:** If you have any questions regarding the application process please email: JrRangerProgram@aguacaliente-nsn.gov
- Step 10:** If you have any questions regarding scheduling, changing or canceling your fieldtrip, please contact Tribal Ranger Raven Longbow (contact information is located in the Field Trip Bus Grants Information Sheet).

Junior Ranger Program – Indian Canyons Field Trip Bus Grants Information Sheet

Background

The Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians is proud to offer a Junior Ranger Field Trip Bus Grant for field trips to the Indian Canyons in Palm Springs. The Indian Canyons offer a wide variety of field trip opportunities including learning about the history and culture of the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians, geology, plants, animals and habitat. The Indian Canyons is located at 38500 S. Palm Canyon in Palm Springs, Calif.

Guidelines

As part of the program, the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians awards Junior Ranger Field Trip Bus Grants. Each grant is valued up to \$700. Special exceptions considered. We accept applications throughout the year.

Eligibility

To request a Junior Ranger Bus Grant, your organization must be an accredited school or a federally tax-exempt section 501 c3 education organization located within 40 miles of the Indian Canyons. Grants are available to classrooms 3rd grade -12th grade. Bus grant applications must be submitted for consideration at least 30 days prior to the desired field trip date. Organizations with pending 501 C3 status are not eligible. Field trips give students an appreciation for environmental sustainability and stewardship as well as culture and history of the Cahuilla people.

Program Overview

- All field trips include Tribal Ranger overview and guided tour
- Picnic tables and restrooms are available
- Required onsite student-to-adult ratio is 1 adult per 10 students
- Attendees should bring water to drink and wear comfortable clothes and sturdy shoes
- Grants must be used to pay for bus transportation for field trips to the Indian Canyons
- Field Trips are available Monday – Friday between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- Reservations are required
- Entrance into the Indian Canyons is free for organized classroom field trips

Bus grants not used must be returned within 15 business days of your scheduled trip (postmarks accepted).
